A Multi-ethnic Vision of the Church

Though Christians, like others in the world, often feel most comfortable with people who are most like themselves, the gospel must be taken beyond our own comfort zone. God wants to use us to share this good news with others in the world, and we may be surprised at how God is already preparing them for the good news. (possibly draw in John 4 of Jesus' example)

Breaking Down Traditional Barriers

God has reconciled us to himself and has given us the ministry of reconciliation. (Could also possibly draw in Ephesians 2, how God has taken down the dividing wall of hostility.)

Christianity and Culture

What's God's expectation for Christians in regard to their culture and their new identity in Christ? We discover that Christianity will force everyone to repent from sin but not necessarily abandon their ethnic or cultural background. We should be cautious to either tolerate sin within or bring a cultural bias into the church. A truly reconciled church welcomes diversity while also pursuing righteousness together (Could also possibly bring in I Corinthians 8 & 10 about not causing your brother to stumble nor discrediting your witness.)
